

Under certain conditions, grade 8 students may "Reach Ahead" to take up to three secondary school courses. The principal of a student's elementary school, with parental consent, may decide that it is appropriate for an academically capable student to enroll in one or more secondary courses, while in grade 8. In such cases, the principal of OVS assumes responsibility for evaluating the student's achievement and for granting and recording credits.

In order to be formally considered for a Reach Ahead request, the following documents are required, along with this form completed:

- o Copy of an elementary report card
- o Birth certificate or any age-related document
